

## “THEY CONTINUED STEADFASTLY”

### INTRODUCTION

#### A. **Acts 2:42**

In this study, we intend to discuss:

1. *“The apostles’ doctrine”*
2. *“Fellowship”*
3. *“The breaking of bread”*
4. *“Prayers”*

#### B. **Acts 2:40-41**

*“They”* under consideration are those who were baptized to be saved.

### I. “IN THE APOSTLES’ DOCTRINE”

#### A. **1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 12:28**

Theirs was the first position God placed within the church.

#### B. **Ephesians 2:19-22; Revelation 21:9-10, 14**

They were instrumental in the foundation of the church.

#### C. **Ephesians 3:1-5; 4:11-13**

They were sent for doctrine.

#### D. **2<sup>nd</sup> Peter 3:1-2; Jude 17**

We should be *“mindful... of the commandments of... the apostles of the Lord”*.

#### E. **Hebrews 2:1-4**

They deserve our *“earnest”* attention.

### II. “AND FELLOWSHIP”

#### A. **2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 6:14-16**

Paul effectively defines *“fellowship”* when he offers several synonyms to the word. These synonyms allow us to see that fellowship is so much more than

mere association or fraternization, so much more than a common meal.

Fellowship is the same as:

1. *“Communion”*
2. *“Accord”*
3. *“Having Part”*
4. *“Agreement”*

**B. 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 1:9**

A faithful Christian is in fellowship with Jesus Christ, though we can't sit down with Jesus in a fellowship hall.

**C. Ephesians 5:11**

You can't have a meal with an *“unfruitful work,”* but you **can** be in fellowship it... by participating in it.

**D. 1<sup>st</sup> John 1:6-7**

*“Fellowship”* transpires between an individual and the Lord when that person *“walk[s] in the light”*. In doing so, he then enters fellowship with others who so walk. Therefore, we can establish fellowship with the apostles when we share with them in obedience to Christ.

**III. “IN THE BREAKING OF BREAD”**

**A. 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 10:16**

There is a bread to break that signifies fellowship with the body of our Lord.

**B. 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 11:23-34**

In breaking this bread, we proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.

**C. Acts 20:7**

The disciples at Troas *“continued steadfastly”* in this, for they *“came together”* for this purpose *“on the first day of the week”*. When we assemble each Lord's Day, we can continue this, too.

**IV. “AND IN PRAYERS”**

**A. 1<sup>st</sup> Thessalonians 5:17; Romans 12:9-12; Luke 18:1-8**

Prayer should be continued steadfastly.

**B. Acts 12:5, 12**

Prayer should be practiced collectively. Notice that “*constant prayer was offered to God... by the church*” and that “*many were gathered together praying*”.

**B.** Would you consider it your habit to constantly:

1. Be taught in the scriptures by the apostles?
2. Walk in the light of Christ so as to maintain fellowship with the apostles?
3. Observe the memorial of the Lord’s Supper?

**C.** If this doesn’t describe you, these habits ought to be developed.
